

## **Firmino Gabriel Mucavele**



**Firmino G. Mucavele** is the Director of the Cabinet for Academic Reform and Regional Integration at the Eduardo Mondlane University and Director General of the International Center for Water Economics and Governance in Africa (IWEGA), former Chief Executive of the New Partnership for Africa's Development (NEPAD) from 2005 to 2008. He holds a PhD in Food and Resource Economics from the University of Florida, United States of America. Professor Mucavele was invited in 2000 by the United Nations to integrate a team of experts to elaborate a development program for a rapid transfer of technologies to the developing countries, which served as basis for the third conference on Science and Technology for the development of Least Developed Countries organized by the United Nations. In February of 2001, Professor Mucavele was invited to integrate the Steering Committee of African Economists to develop the Millennium Africa Recovery Program (MAP) which was presented and approved by the Heads of African States in Lusaka, July of 2001 and became the New African Initiative, later in 23 of October, 2001, in Abuja was designated the New Partnership for African Development (NEPAD).
