Challenge Programme Water And Food: Basin Development Challenges of the CPWF

## **Summary:**

The project focuses on water and land rights/access, management and governance. L4 seeks to provide the people and governments of the Limpopo Basin with:

1. A package of ways to organise access to water for multiple uses from farm level to water management area level
2. A package of ways to organise the technologies with which they manage and control water for multiple uses
3. The enabling policy and legal environments to support the above and the manner in which this governance framework impacts on smallholders

The project considers (multiple) water use and the full water cycle, including management of rainwater, rainfed agriculture and rainfed pasture – the green water component – alongside the management of runoff, groundwater and stored surface water - the blue water component. It will emphasize the multiple use services approach which prevails in most of the small water infrastructure in the service of rural communities.
